ORDINANCE NO. 94-08-18

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING ASSESSMENTS IN THE INDIAN HILLS  
AND LITTLE WALNUT MOBILE RANCH SUBDIVISIONS AND SETTING  
THE TIME AND TERMS BY WHICH SUCH ASSESSMENTS WILL BE PAID  
AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES AND STANDARDS FOR ASSESSMENT  
ADJUSTMENTS TO ALLOW FOR TRANSFER OF PROPERTY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of Grant  
County that:

SECTION I - Title

This Ordinance may be cited as the Indian Hills and Little  
Walnut Mobile Ranch Subdivisions Improvement District, and is  
enacted pursuant to Article 55A, County Improvement Districts  
Sections 4-55A-1 et seq.

Section II - Declaration of Intent and Purpose

Pursuant to Article 55A Section 4-55A-3, et seq., which  
authorizes Counties to create improvement districts for public  
safety, health or welfare, the Board of Grant County Commissioners  
does hereby declare their purpose and intent to enact an ordinance  
to:

1. levy the assessments on the landowners of record, named  
in the assessment roll, which is filed in the office of  
the Grant County Clerk in Miscellaneous records Book #233  
page 2052-2060 and which has been confirmed by Resolution  
94-07-21; and,
2. set the terms of payment at five equal monthly payments  
due at the end of the month and payable at the Grant  
County Treasurer's Office.


Any tract or parcel of land so assessed shall not be relieved  
from the assessment or lien by the sale of the tract or parcel of  
land for general taxes or any other assessment subject to the  
provisions of Section 4-55A-26 NMSA 1978 Comp.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED that the Board of Grant County Commissioners levy the assessments as confirmed by resolution and contained in the assessment roll and set the terms of payment at five equal monthly payments, due at the end of the month and payable at the Grant County Treasurer's Office.




