

ORDINANCE NO. 00-03-09A

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING A MORATORIUM PROHIBITING THE
ERECTION OF CERTAIN SIGNS WITHIN THE JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES
OF GRANT COUNTY FOR A PERIOD OF FOUR MONTHS FROM THE
EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the County of Grant currently has no ordinances or
policies in effect governing the standards for erection of signs in
Grant County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Grant County has
received complaints regarding the public safety of certain signs
located along state highways and major arterials within the
jurisdiction of Grant County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, having reviewed this
situation, believes that a four-month moratorium on the erection of
certain signs for the purpose of studying and adopting a sign
standards ordinance is in the best interest of the citizens of
Grant County;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County
Commissioners of Grant County hereby orders a temporary moratorium
prohibiting the erection of any signs that are free-standing and
over 15-feet in height or over 50 square feet in surface area, and
not regulated by a sign ordinance, within the jurisdictional
boundaries of Grant County for a period of four months from the
effective date of this Ordinance.
