

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO 2002-1


The following amendment to Ordinance No. 2002-1 is proposed to comply with New Mexico law:


Section 4-2. RABIES CONTROL


- 1) Annual Vaccination: It is the duty of every owner or keeper of a dog or cat over age of three months to have such animal vaccinated annually against rabies, ~~by a licensed veterinarian.~~ The animal shall receive a booster within the 12-month interval following the initial vaccination. Every domestic dog and cat shall be revaccinated against rabies within 12 months if a 1-year vaccine is administered or within 36 months if a 3-year vaccine is administered with a rabies vaccine licensed by the United States Department of Agriculture and administered according to label recommendations. The "Compendium of Animal Rabies Control (CARC)," published by the National Association of Public Health Veterinarians, Inc., shall be the reference for the route of inoculation and the type of vaccine. Every veterinarian who vaccinates a dog or cat in Grant County shall issue to the owner or keeper of the animal, a numbered vaccination certificate containing the name and address of the owner of the animal, a description of the animal vaccinated, the type of vaccine used, the date of vaccination, and the expiration date of the period of immunity. Veterinarians who vaccinate such dog or cat must also provide a copy of the vaccination certificate to the licensing authority.




