

**GRANT COUNTY
RESOLUTION NO. R-13-45**

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THAT GRANT COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 13-06, AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE DECLARING A FIRE HAZARD EMERGENCY AND ENACTING MEASURES TO DECREASE THE COUNTY'S RISK OF INJURY TO PERSONS OR PROPERTY AND SUBSTANTIAL FINANCIAL LOSS TO THE COUNTY OF GRANT AND ITS RESIDENTS AS A RESULT OF FIRE, IS NO LONGER IN EFFECT

WHEREAS, on July 3, 2013, the Grant County Board of Commissioner (Board) held a special meeting at which the Board recognized the severity of the drought conditions and high fire potential in Grant County and determined that protective measures needed to be taken to protect the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens and to decrease the risk of injury to persons and property;

WHEREAS, on July 3, 2013, the Board adopted an emergency ordinance, Ordinance No. 13-06, declaring a fire hazard emergency and imposing burn restrictions in Grant County;

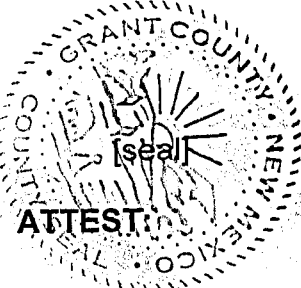
WHEREAS, the ordinance provided that it "shall remain in effect unless and until the Grant County Board of Commissioners adopts a resolution indicating that the ordinance is no longer in effect"; and

WHEREAS, the Board held an emergency hearing on July 18, 2013, to determine if the weather and fire conditions have improved since it adopted the emergency ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Board finds that the weather and fire conditions have improved such that Ordinance No. 13-06, An Emergency Ordinance Declaring a Fire Hazard Emergency and Enacting Measures to Decrease the County's Risk of Injury to Persons or Property and Substantial Financial Loss to the County of Grant and Its Residents as a Result of Fire, is no longer warranted.
2. That effective immediately, Ordinance No. 13-06 is no longer in effect.


