WHEREAS, the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish in cooperation with the United States Forestry Service and the Bureau of Land Management have implemented the Sikes Act; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Act is to generate revenues to be used in designated areas, for the purpose of improving existing facilities or to develop new facilities that will benefit or improve the habitat of wildlife and fish; and

WHEREAS, the Bear Creek Canyon Lake and Lake Roberts are the principal fishing and recreation attractions for Grant County and there is a tremendous economic impact as a result of tourism to the municipalities in the County; and


WHEREAS, there is a critical need to provide for the necessary care and maintenance to protect these valuable resources in Grant County.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Commissioners of Grant County, respectfully urge the Honorable Bruce King, Governor of the State of New Mexico, the Honorable Pete Domenici, the Honorable Jeff Bingaman, the United States Forest Service, the New Mexico Game and Fish Department, to endorse the proposed restoration project of our lakes as the number one priority for the southwest quadrant of the State of New Mexico.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Grant County will cooperate with all agencies involved, to the extent legally possible, to accomplish the goals of the restoration projects for area lakes.

Done this 3rd day of October, 1991 by the Board of Grant County Commissioners, at Silver City, Grant County, New Mexico.



