**RESOLUTION NO. 15-41**

**A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING FIVE SINGLE MEMBER COUNTY  
COMMISSIONER DISTRICTS PURSUANT TO ARTICLE X, SECTION 7 OF  
THE NEW MEXICO CONSTITUTION AND GRANT COUNTY  
ORDINANCE NO. O-15-04**

**WHEREAS**, Article X, § 7 of the New Mexico State Constitution provides that a “board of county commissioners by unanimous vote may adopt an ordinance to increase the size of the board[] of county commissioners to five members”; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 27, 2015, the Board approved Ordinance No. O-15-04, An Ordinance Increasing the Size of the Board of Grant County Commissioners to Five Members Pursuant to Article X, Section 7 of the New Mexico Constitution; and

**WHEREAS**, Article X, § 7 of the New Mexico State Constitution mandates that “[u]pon creation of a five-member board, the county shall be divided by the incumbent board of the county commissioners into five county commission districts that shall be compact, contiguous and as nearly equal in population as practicable.”

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF GRANT COUNTY, NEW MEXICO** that the attached **Plan A** shall comprise the five single member districts for all elections to the office of County Commissioner of the County of Grant, New Mexico, commencing in 2016 and continuing thereafter.

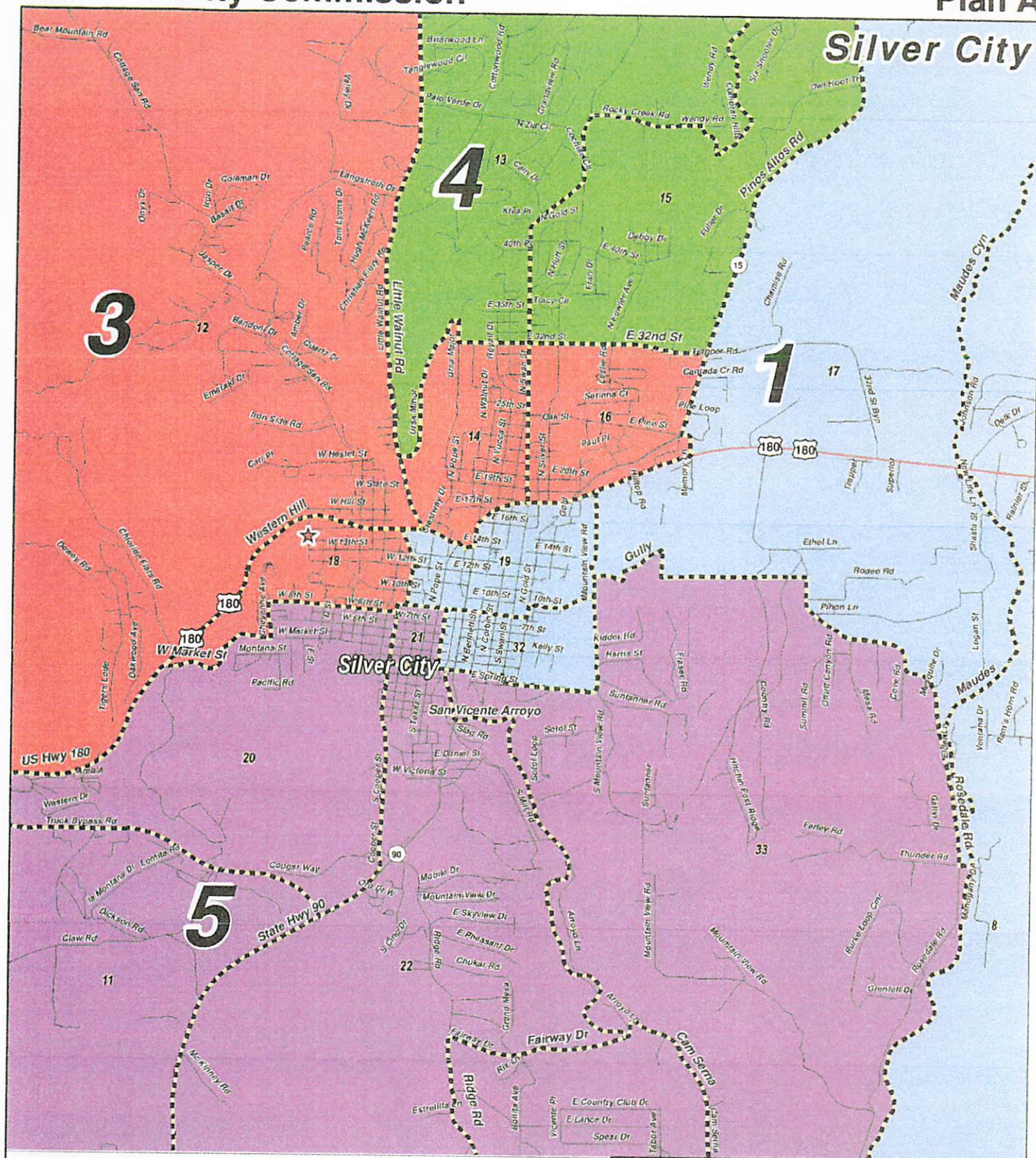

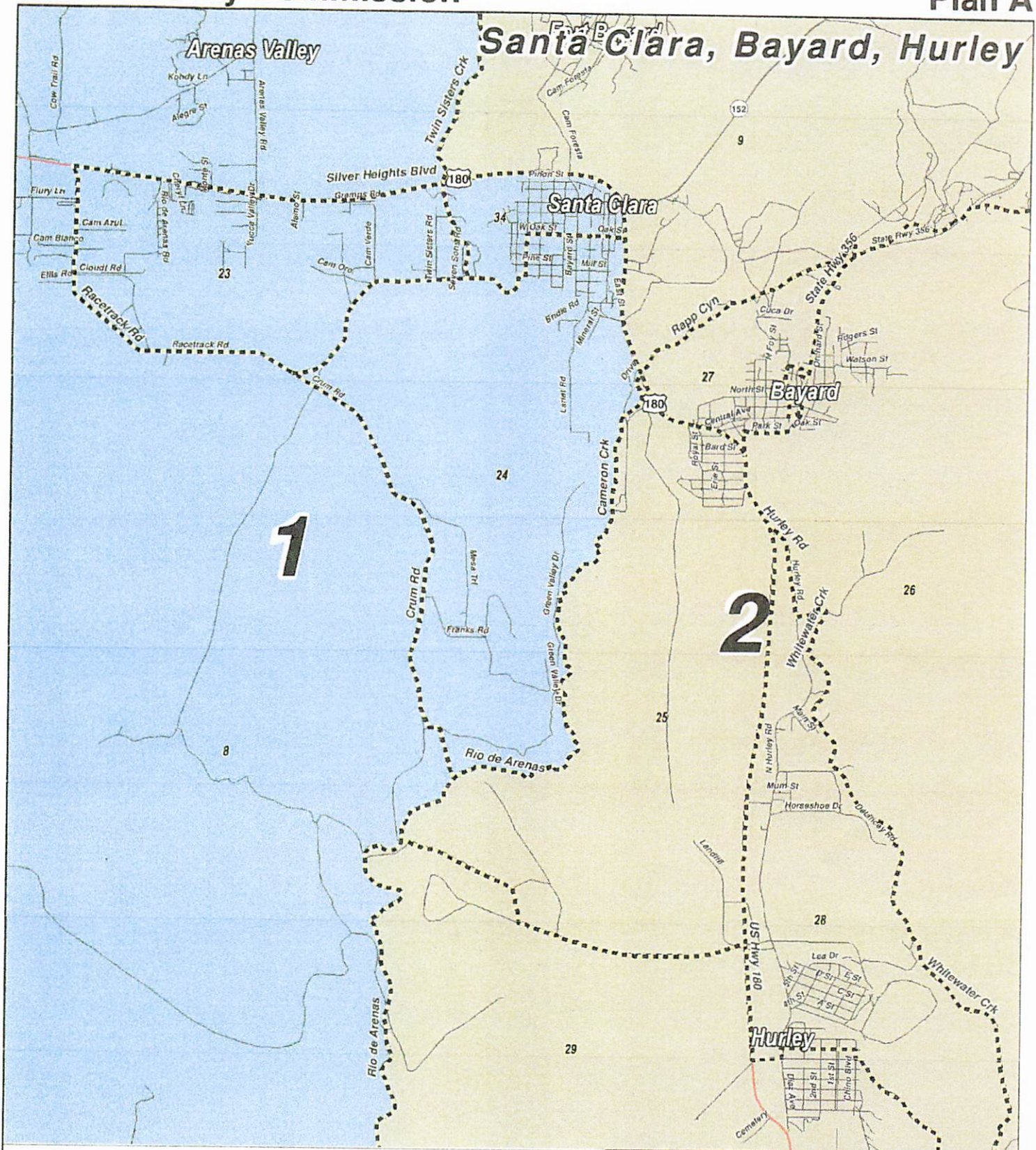
