



## Grant County Nuisance Wildlife Guide

The purpose of this resource guide is to provide instruction and assistance to the public when dealing with nuisance-wildlife such as stinging insects, bats, skunks, rats, gophers, snakes, woodpeckers, deer, coyotes, bears, and mountain lions.
