

**STATE OF NEW MEXICO

RESOLUTION NO. R-19-19**

**SPECIFYING THE SALARIES OF ELECTED OFFICIALS AND CHIEF DEPUTIES IN
GRANT COUNTY, NEW MEXICO**

WHEREAS, Section 4-44-4.1 NMSA 1978 establishes a maximum salary for elected county officials; and

WHEREAS, Grant County is classified as a B over County; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico Legislature amended the statute in 2018 regarding the salaries that elected officials are eligible to receive; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution repeals Resolution R-18-19 in its entirety; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Grant County, New Mexico, pursuant to state statute, that the salaries for elected officials for Grant County shall be as follows:

Effective January 1, 2019, the salary for Sheriff is \$66,250, Assessor is \$63,590, Commissioner District 1 & 2 is \$25,334, Probate Judge is \$22,231; Effective January 1, 2021, the salary for the Clerk and Treasurer shall be \$63,590, Commissioner District 3, 4 & 5 shall be \$25,334.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the appointed Chief Deputy Clerk, Chief Deputy Treasurer, Chief Deputy Assessor and Chief Deputy Sheriff salaries shall be set at 90 % of the salary of the office's elected official salary and the Chief Deputy Assessor shall be entitled to applicable Appraiser qualification incentive payments pursuant to Section 4-39-5, NMSA 1978 not to exceed \$7,500.


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
